CREWE AND NANTWICH U3A NEWS

'I moved into the area 3 years ago after losing my wife and u3a has been a life saver, enabling me to meet so many new people. '(Member)

In April, members of Crewe and Nantwich u3a will celebrate their 30th anniversary and a small group of committee members have spent the last year planning several events to celebrate this landmark, to ensure we live up to the u3a motto 'Learn, Laugh, Live!' Since its official opening in April 1995, Crewe and Nantwich u3a has grown from an organisation comprising several small but popular groups, to one where members have the choice of over 95 groups, covering subjects ranging from Art Appreciation to Yoga Fit. (We do not have a Zoology or Zen group, but we would welcome anyone who wants to start one!)

Members pay a yearly fee (currently £14) then choose to join those groups which cover their interests, such as painting, listening to opera, fitness groups at Shavington Gym (charge set by the gym), pickleball and table tennis, various Bridge groups, reading, Book Chat, local history, crafts and needlework, a team quiz, languages, choirs and many others. Groups meet weekly, fortnightly or monthly.

Our walking groups cover distances between 2-8/9 miles and some of them combine walking with a meal in a pub near the location of the walk. Venue-based groups attract a £1.50 levy to cover group and room hire costs. Outdoor groups, where there is no cost to candnu3a to hire a venue, attract no levy.

There is a monthly Medieval History group which meets online and we also have a face to face IT Help group which can be accessed weekly. We are always keen to speak to members who would like to start a new group and share their interests with others.

COUNCILLOR LINDA BUCHANAN

UPDATE RE-ENFORCEMENT AND INFRASTRUCTURE WORKS BEING CARRIED OUT ON CREWE ROAD, SHAVINGTON.

When I was elected as Ward Councillor, I immediately became aware of waterlogging and flooding issues for residents on Crewe Road. These issues had been ongoing since 2018 following a new development. Residents will have clearly seen the flooding caused on Crewe Road from the traffic lights with Newcastle Road to Cherry Tree Park development.

As our village grows, and we welcome new residents to it, we need to understand the existing utility infrastructure is under pressure that it has not had to cope with before.

Cheshire Highways and the flood risk team have been working hard to find a solution to reinforce and upgrade our existing drainage infrastructure to alleviate the issues you can see, as well as those you can't see.

In September 2023 a Council contractor was used to clear a Victorian culverted drain from Crewe Road to Camelot Grove resulting in the removal of 70 tons of silt.

In January 2025 work commenced to alleviate the issues at the back of the houses on Crewe Road. A 150-metre length of modern plastic pipe is being laid from the rear of Diamond Close to Crewe Road, which will have to negotiate around existing:

- Water main
- Gas main
- Two low voltage power connections

The new pipes will direct water back into the water course toward Crewe Road. This will create greater capacity within the UU combined sewer reducing the risk of sewage flooding properties further down the sewer network.

PCSO

Update on PCSO funding for Shavington-cum-Gresty

The Parish Council would like to inform you of an important update regarding the funding of our local Police Community Support Officer (PCSO). After careful consideration, Shavington-cum-Gresty Parish Council has decided to revert the responsibility for funding back to Cheshire Constabulary, this funding model has been adopted by many other local parishes such as Wybunbury, Willaston, and Rope for some time. This decision follows a detailed report by the Parish Clerk, which evaluated the cost-effectiveness of maintaining a dedicated PCSO and compared our service with that of other parishes.

Shavington-cum-Gresty has been one of the few remaining parishes in Cheshire East funding a dedicated PCSO. However, over the past four years, the cost of this arrangement has risen by more than 30%, and the additional expenditure has not had a marked impact on crime reduction.

Despite this change, the Parish will continue to have a named PCSO, ensuring residents retain a direct point of contact for policing matters. The Parish Council will remain engaged with Cheshire Constabulary to address any local issues. We also wish to reassure residents that on a day-to-day level, there will be no change in how policing concerns are handled, and the same channels of communication with our PCSO remain available.

The Parish Council will be able to focus resources on other key local projects, whilst still benefiting from the community policing model that has worked successfully in surrounding areas. More information about these initiatives will be shared in the coming months.

- Non-emergencies: Call 101 or visit the Cheshire Constabulary website to report incidents online.
- Local issues and information: Visit the Cheshire Constabulary website's section on Shavington, Willaston, and Rope to view crime statistics and learn about our local policing team.

We appreciate your understanding and remain committed to ensuring the safety and well-being of all residents.
