#### SHAVINGTON SCOUT GROUP

As we move into the summer term, all our sections are operating pretty much at capacity, which means that we have a waiting list, particularly for Beavers.

This is good news, after the period when we had no Leaders, were meeting with Willaston and were down to 5 Beavers in total. Now we are over-subscribed, and have no places available until at least the start of 2024!

We cannot increase our capacity due to the size of our HQ, for safety reasons. This is not a unique problem across our District – most Beaver Colonies are in a similar situation where demand far outweighs availability. But we also need the adult volunteers in sufficient numbers to be able to operate.

The national census of Scout Groups, taken annually at the end of January, has shown a marked decline in the numbers of adult volunteers at the same time as a steady increase in the number of young members. This means that at some point there will be Sections which cannot continue because they have too few adults, not because there is no interest from young people.

It's a great time to join Scouting. The weather (hopefully) improves and the days get longer giving us more scope to be out-of-doors rather than indoors enjoying nature, exploring, discovering, learning and having fun with our friends!

It's fun for adults too! Otherwise we wouldn't continue to give our time voluntarily to helping young people to learn and develop in a safe and controlled environment.

This weekend will see hundreds of Scouts hiking across Cheshire. They will have navigated their route and will be carrying with them everything they might need. They have been practicing for weeks, and those that succeed will celebrate a memorable achievement. We wish our teams well! If you have ever been a Cub or a Scout (or a Brownie or Guide), then you will remember the types of activities that you enjoyed because you were a member and might not otherwise have had the opportunity to try.

We are currently getting ready for our District Camp which is held at Milldale, our District camp site at the end of April. There will be hundreds of young people and adults on-site for the weekend, and an exciting programme of activities is planned for them. It includes Beavers, Cubs, Scouts and Explorers and this year the theme is "Myths and Legends". Whatever the weather does, this weekend will be enjoyed and remembered for many years.

If you enjoy outdoor activities then why not consider joining our team of adult volunteers? We have a small but dedicated team and will always welcome new members. There are a variety of roles, not necessarily working directly with the youngsters. It's a great addition to a CV too, as Scouting is recognised for its comprehensive training programme for both young people and adults and can make a real difference when it comes to the competition for jobs or university places.

#### **COUNCILLOR DAVID MARREN**

May 3<sup>rd</sup> 2023 is the last day of the current electoral period; a day when Councillors finish their 48 months term of office.

This last term of office has been different than any other in memory. On May 2<sup>nd</sup> 2019, candidates to Cheshire East Council were elected, with the first full Council meeting being held on the 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2019. There were full Council meetings held on the 19<sup>th</sup> December 2019 and also on the 20<sup>th</sup> February 2020 and then Covid-19 struck. The next face to face Council meeting was held on the 15<sup>th</sup> December 2021; that is nearly 22 months later!!! Most Council Officers still work from home! That isn't a criticism, just an observation that there has been massive change to how officers and Councillors now work following a time of great loss.

One thing I am quite proud of, was an amendment I moved to the 2021/2022 budget, conducted over the Computer, using "Teams". I think it is the only amendment made to the budget over the last four years and it was about creating a Ward budget of £4,200 for each Councillor to spend in their own wards. No Conservative Councillors supported the amendment that I moved, (a fact that can be proven as it was a recorded named vote) but it was passed, which meant that Officers had to make it work although even that didn't happen with any enthusiasm. I don't think any Councillor managed to spend their budget in the first year, but satisfyingly, the budget from the first year rolled over to the second, 2022/2023. I spent part of my budget on a safety concern. A resident complained to me that young children could easily run out from the playpark on Needhams Grange straight into the path of traffic on Crewe road; I spent some of the money on a safety barrier. With the rest, some street lighting has been ordered and that should go up soon on the Public Right of Way between Ashcroft Avenue and Greenfields Avenue,

The idea of Ward budgets has proven so popular that the 2023/24 Budget increased the £4,200 to £10,000 per councillor, but it does have to be highways related spending.

In other news, I blocked a Toucan Crossing from being constructed at the end of the cycle path on Rope Lane as I felt it would have been £120,000 down the drain. The battle with Highways took me two years but I've now had written confirmation that a Puffin Crossing is to be constructed in the vicinity of Broomhall Drive.

As for the Pedestrian Crossing on Crewe Road, that has been a nightmare! I was chasing this up in 2019 but it got delayed by Covid; then delayed by backlog of work and by worker shortages and other excuses. I've recently been dealing with the installer directly and we are now nearly there; if not actually there by the time you read this.

To let you know what I have been doing and what CEC has been doing, I maintained a group site called Shavington Electoral Ward and Cheshire East Councillor (<u>https://www.facebook.com/groups/2644495902291495</u>) **exclusively** for those that live within Shavington Electoral Ward and who are recorded on the Electoral Roll. On this site I listed all Planning Applications, opportunities that are limited like council job vacancies and those issues I needed to post to sound out views. I posted in this group almost daily and they **would** have been about issues that affect you. There is zero nastiness on this site. I'm hoping to keep it going.

Additionally, I maintained a page on Facebook called David M a r r e n @ b e t t e r d e a l f o r s h a v i n g t o n (<u>https://www.facebook.com/betterdealforshavington</u>). Anyone could access this site. I used it to publicise forthcoming roadworks, grants that are available, Cheshire East Council issues and lots more. Again, I posted information affecting the ward and wider area virtually every day. There is also zero nastiness on this site and I'm hoping to keep it going.

#### SHAVINGTON CLEAN TEAM
